More politics in the shooting sports!

Oh heck, I am sure you are thinking, enuff! (Me too, but it *is* election year - whee!)

Well, apart from the General Election (please vote, and remember, you have *TWO* votes!) there are some more news from our police about controlling our firearms. (Yep, I know, there's enough damage been done already, but not all of the stuff which follows is bad!).

1. The Firearms Safety Authority (*Te Tari Pūreke* (TTP)) has a small team exploring the 'firearms ecosystem', meaning the firearms environment and all that plays a part in shaping the environment for their use in New Zealand. It is doing this to "inform te

Firearms System Oversight Group" and TTP's community partnerships and codesigning". These include rules and regulations; actors, drivers and influences of behaviors ('stakeholders'); physical stocks; and processes.

- 2. This research team is looking at seven questions;
 - "From your perspective, what do good community partnerships , and good codesign, look like?
 - What do communities that you represent care about? What outcomes do they want to see?
 - What current partnerships or co-design initiatives, between the regulator and the community, do you think, or worked well?
 - What current partnerships or co-design initiatives, do you think are not working as well as they could, and (if worth investing in) what would improve them?
 - What other opportunities for partnerships, or co-design, could be considered?
 - How else could *Te Tari Pūreke* be supporting better outcomes for Māori ad vulnerable communities? Is our approach to partnerships diverse enough to meet all cultural needs of our communities?
 - How could *Te Tari Pūreke* hold themselves accountable to true partnerships and co-design opportunities with our communities? How will we know we are getting it right?" (Minutes of Firearm Community Advisory Forum meeting for 29 June 2023, pp. 2 & 3).

My comments: these are from the perspective of the *TTP* 'reaching out' and working to improve relationships with firearm owners and the wider community generally. It is a genuine effort to improve matters (which have been fractured at times).

3. TTP is working to fix some issues about firearm safety in the recently published "Firearm Safety Code" and other details arising from the implementation of changes which affect us all.

Other news: the ACT Party has released its firearm policy, with which it is difficult to find fault, although some of the new measures remain in it. Contact me for a copy, but it is available on their website.

Rifle (bolt out) + ammo – Up to and including .308/7.62 calibre Bipod or other front support and rear support.

The range will be operated by a designated Rang Officer who will make themselves known at the range.

General format will be

Allocation of target frame

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m

Shooting 200m and beyond after validation

Dates: The range is not for casual use but is available for use on the following dates: Currently over the Summer Range is available Sundays (except over Xmas) 11am to 1pm,100yards to 200 yards After which there is a NRA style shoot at longer ranges Range fee is \$10.00
