You must be a financial member when you took the Trophy and to enter. That is financial member for last year 2023 to 2024 as well as this year 2024 to 2025. (unless Trophy taken since 1st March then only 2024/25 year)

The following is the second of a series of articles on hunting in New Caledonia written by John Berry (who has had to sadly give up hunting due to old age) and provided to me by his friend Geoff Jukes.

The Dog

I was sitting on the front veranda of the Deva camp talking to one of a group of Floridian clients, when a battered old Toyota Land Cruiser pulled up.

It was being driven by a young French farm hand from the station headquarters, who wanted to speak with us to improve his grasp of English. It also contained "**THE DOG**".

The dog was not impressive - medium sized, short coated, black and white, with a long tail and a very mixed parentage. It looked ill fed and prone to mange. It cowered behind the young Frenchman and regarded us with suspicion.

Well the obvious question was asked by my client.

Rifle (bolt out) + ammo – Up to and including .308/7.62 calibre Bipod

or other front support and rear support.

The range will be operated by a designated Rang Officer who will make themselves known at the range.

General format will be

Allocation of target frame

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m

Shooting 200m and beyond after validation

Dates: The range is not for casual use but is available for use on the following dates: Currently over the Summer Range is available Sundays (except over Xmas) 11am to 1pm,100yards to 200 yards. After which there is a NRA style shoot at longer ranges Range fee is \$10.00
