Editorial



Last Month I took the opportunity to hunt Cavalier Block on Stewart Island. A place I had always wanted to have a good look at. It was good to be there while the hunting is still worthwhile. Don't expect it to be so once 6kg of 1080 per hectare is laded there. Deer not being the target species is not valid. They will be collateral damage like civilians in the war zones around the world. Good deer repellent may reduce the damage. But a dosage of 1080 designed to kill each and every rat, cat and possum will have an effect.

Moving on the weather was mainly shit, but great to be there and get away from the troubled world.

Though I had heard about it before the amount of gorse there surprised me. Why has Doc not sprayed it while the area is limited? It is only going to get worse. I consider it a far worse weed than the marron grass they have been spraying at Masons Bay for some years.

Some Southland Branch Members did some work on Gorse removal with six trips to the Bay a few years ago but gave up as Doc was not interested. See conservation work on Southland Branch web site for more details.

Gorse and other weeds/ pests will continue to arrive at the likes of Stewart Island by sea (or with human help). Such pests need removed before established. (One only has to see what floats up on the high tide line like a plastic CAC Shot gun case. How long since it was manufactured?)

For my money Doc should be spending their money on preventing new pests becoming established and spreading, before attempting to eliminate the well-established, widespread and hard to remove, by spending the millions of dollars Doc claims it does not have. Perhaps there is no glory in removing gorse, but rats, cats, and a by kill of the deer now that is something?

On an unfortunate but positive note we found a dead Turtle on the high tide line. Took a photo and reported it to Doc who appreciated our reporting the sad event. Turns out it's a juvenile green Turtle.

Further on stuff washed up we found a large cut log. It had the remains of a wire rope sticking out of it, well weathered by the water, of how long at sea? Where from? On other matters there are moves to harvest 50,000 more dear a year in Scotland and sell the meat. Something that may affect current moves to expand the Feral Venison Industry here in New Zealand again, as the effects of Covid to the European Restaurant trade wear off. This remains main market for NZ venison both Farmed and Feral. We need a controlled and responsible feral venison industry to keep the deer numbers here in balance with the environment. We don't need an over exploitive industry that reduces numbers to a level that makes its operations and recreational hunting not viable. Any chance of some good news come New Year we must be due?

The following is one of a series of articles on hunting in New Caledonia written by John Berry (who has had to sadly give up hunting due to old age) and provided to me by his friend Geoff Jukes.

My Last Hurrah

The client was from Maine and had hunted in New Zealand the week before, we both flew to New Caledonia for his Rusa hunt on the Air New Zealand Saturday flight. He, his wife and myself were met at Tontouta airport by John Francois and taken back to La Foa to settle in.

Sunday produced nothing of note and as it was quite late in the season there was little or no roaring. The best plan seemed to be to place ourselves between the night feeding areas and bush cover that provided shelter during daylight hours.

There is such a place within a few minutes of La Foa, so Monday saw us heading towards a suitable spot before daylight. It is not hard to get up early in La Foa – you are not faced with freezing cold like New Zealand and you get a breakfast of coffee and croissants before you leave.


The plan was to ascend a grass spur, which separated the bush cover from a large area of rolling grass land, the night feeding area. I had used this strategy several times in previous hunts and it worked well.

On this occasion, we were about half way to our glassing point, when we came upon a stag laying asleep 50 metres in front us. I was not convinced that he was "A Shooter" but before I could make a call my man had dispatched him. A very good shot – the stag never woke up.

It turned out later when the head was scored in the US that due to a 7^{th} non typical point it was the new # 2 free ranging Rusa! Not too bad for my last hunt.



Joke of The Month





Since last month (October) a lot has happened:

Sika Show – last weekend at Mystery Creek, Hamilton (new venue) New Zealand's largest outdoor show got under way.



Scene from the 2024 Sika Show at Mystery Creek, HNZDA and COLFO were there among 259 of other exhibitors, if you can ever get away to the North Island for a look, it is well worthwhile. Politicians were there in strength of course, both with their party booths and mixing and mingling with exhibitors.

Coronial inquest, second phase just completed, examined the police firearms licensing process, Tarrant's online radicalization, and future responses to violent extremism. Its relevance to us is its findings are very likely to determine our future firearm laws. We were ably represented by former COLFO chairman Michael Dowling.

"The Council of Licensed Firearm Owners says the responsibility of closing the MSSA magazine loophole used by the Christchurch terrorist sat with Police and Government, and no one else.

Any assertion by the media that the firearms community are to blame ignores the obvious: the Police drove discussion on the issue and failed to change the rules.

COLFO Spokesperson Hugh Devereux-Mack says Police are shirking responsibility for their failure to close the MSSA loophole, and the media are aiding them.

"It pains us to have to make this clear to the 'fourth estate' of journalism, but COLFO and the firearms community has never had a policy or decision-making role, so had no responsibility to seek an end to the loophole.

"Neither are we responsible for the failure by Police and Government to close the MSSA loophole, because we hold no power.

Arms (Shooting Clubs, Shooting Ranges, and Other Matters) Amendment Bill (2024)

This Bill seeks to undo some of the changes made by the 'second amendment', the Arms Legislation Act 2020 which among other matters, required police approval of all small arms ranges. Unfortunately the Bill still requires, not police approval, but simply requires us to "enroll" our non-pistol ranges. Unsure of what that means!

With an injury casualty rate of less than one a year, it is difficult to figure how the Commissioner can see his way to reduce injuries when they only rarely occur.

Please take care when you are driving, the police are working to suggest that driving offending indicate you may no longer be a fit and proper person to have firearms. This may mean you lose your firearm licence.

Take care, and LOOK TWICE!

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m

Shooting 200m and beyond after validation
