

**Editorial** 

Recently I came across an article in the online news. Where dozens of Huts in Te Urewera (formerly Urewera National Park) are to me removed buy Te Uru Taumatua. (Tuhoe body that runs the area since The Tuhoe Tribe took it back from the Department of Conservation in a treaty settlement in 2014). Doc who still owns the huts, has no objection to their removal. Though some appear to have a different opinion? These huts along with other structures Bridges etc. Have lacked maintenance since Tuhoe taking ownership of the land. This appears due to disagreements between them and Doc since 2014. (Goggle the story online). Some "bespoke structures" are to be built to replace the huts.

Hunters use most if not all these huts each Roar, but a lot lack use at other times. To me looking from afar, can see the danger of hunters replacing these huts with ramshackle Bivi's of various sorts. Worse that the current neglected Huts?

Sounds like we could end up with the mess, in the Te Urewera. That was on Stewart Island prior to the Rakiura Hunters Camp Trust building the hunters huts currently there, and removing the Rubbish Biv's, it has worked well on the Island, well done.

Meanwhile some of the politically correct movers and shakers, (influencers) on the current affairs programme "Sunday" on 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct. When talking about the increasing deer population which they wanted controlled, by hunters. We're asking why there were not more people going hunting? Which is at odds with the same group promoting restrictions on firearms ownership. Note no mention was made on the programme of access problems for hunters. Or the Current delays in getting a firearms licence. NZDA or the Game Council were not interviewed either, why!

#### Hunting cartridges then and now

#### Introduction

Things which make a cartridge popular include the availability of both rifles and ammunition, for it, whether the rifles are suitable for New Zealand hunting conditions, and whether the cartridge hash enough power to ensure quick kills of the wild animals we hunt. Decades ago, the .303 British did the trick, with cheap rifles, cheap ammo, and everyone had one. Things got a bit more complicated when people started using everything from .222 Remington to 8 x 57 Mauser and beyond: lots of hunters began using telescopic sights too (this was back in the 1960s).

#### What was 'out there?'

Some amazing calibers were around then – the .280 Ross (think 7 mm Remington Magnum, but a century ago), the .318 Westley Richards (a cross between a .30'06 and an 8 x 57 Mauser) for example as well as .577 snider, the 450 Martini henry and of course, the .303 British. The .44-40 was quite widely used too, and eventually the .270 Winchester, the 7 x 57 Mauser and the .308 Winchester, the latter appearing from the early 1950s as CAC ammunition (went out of business in 1981) began manufacturing ammunition for it.

Then .243 Winchester appeared in the late 1950s, and the heyday of American sporting cartridge development was sprung upon us in New Zealand, as hunting magazines, mostly from the USA, told of wondrous cartridges which almost weekly, it seemed were introduced, largely because a new cartridge ensures new rifle sales!

#### **New Zealand hunters**

New Zealand hunters soon thought then .303 rifles they were using, as well as being hard to fit telescopic sights to, were somewhat passé, and soon flocked to the newer (younger) chambering's and of course the new rifles that used them. (If you used a .303 rifle in the 1970s, what sort of hunter were you?)

The rash of new cartridges of the 1990s and the '00s, such as the 'super short magnums' caught the attention of many hunters, leading to a fleet of used but serviceable hunting rifles in suitable hunting calibers such as .308 and .270 Winchester, 6.5 Swede and .30-30 Winchester coming onto the market.

They still work well on deer! (Next month I might continue with this unless the readers want something better).



Firearms Licence and Deerstalkers membership card.

Ear and eye protection

Target capable of being stapled to the target frame

Rifle (bolt out) + ammo – Up to and including .308/7.62 calibre

Bipod or other front support and rear support.

The range will be operated by a designated Rang Officer who will make themselves known at the range.

General format will be

Allocation of target frame

Validation of rifle being able to hit target at 100m

Shooting 200m and beyond after validation

Dates: The range is not for casual use but is available for use on the following dates:
Currently over the Summer Range is available Sundays (except over Xmas) 11am to
1pm,100yards to 200 yards. After which there is a NRA style shoot at longer ranges Range fee is \$10.00
